In August, 1998, the Boys & Girls Club of Casa Grande officially began operations as a school-based after-school program. Over the past 25 years, we have changed our name three times and now operate eight Clubs- one in Arizona City, five in Casa Grande and two in Maricopa.

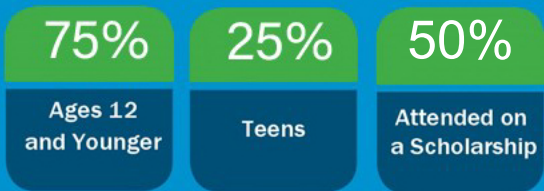
Our Reach

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

At each after-school Club, students have an opportunity to complete homework between 3:00 p.m. and 3:45 p.m. Club staff are available to assist with homework.

School collaboration allows the Club and teachers to develop plans for members to build competencies in challenging subjects if requested.

Pre-pandemic, students who attended one of our Clubs more than 104 times during the school-year were more likely than their peers to pass the math and reading portions of their state tests.

Each Club member rotates daily through the following activities: Art Room, Game Room, Computer Room, Free time/Homework help, and Outside Play.

Club members that demonstrate positive relationships with others, are responsible and show overall good moral character. Keystone Club is a teens service club that actively participates in community service projects.

Club members are taught and expected to abide by the "I WILLs."

HEALTHY LIFESTYLES

We incorporate Positive Action, a program that addresses diverse problems, such as substance use, violence-related behavior, disruptive behavior, and bullying, as well as social-emotional learning, positive youth development, character, and academics.

Children get 45 minutes of organized outside play time as well as 45 minutes of free outside play, if they choose not to work on homework. Outside play includes: kickball, baseball, soccer, and Triple Play.

Triple Play is a Boys & Girls Club experience to challenge members to become healthy and active by learning new ways to maintain physical fitness and form positive relationships with peers.
